"Hearts Without Blame" (1Thessalonians 3:11-4:2)

- A. Prayer for reunion and increased love (1Th. 3:11-13)
- B. Excel still more (1Th. 4:1-2)

- A. Prayer for reunion and increased love (1Th. 3:11-13)
 - 1. (vs. 11) This is a simple request reflecting a very real wish in the heart of Paul.
 - a. The appeal is to both, "our God and Father Himself and Jesus our Lord."
 - b. The content of the appeal is that God would "direct our way to you"

- 2. (vs. 12) More appeals follow: "may the Lord cause you"
 - a. "to increase"
 - b. "and abound in love"
 - > "for one another,"
 - > "and for all men"
 - "just as we also do for you"

- 3. (vs. 13) Here is the purpose for the requested reunion and love:
 - a. "so that He may establish your hearts"
 - > "without blame in holiness"
 - "before our God and Father"
 - "at the coming of our Lord Jesus"
 - o "with all His saints."

- B. Excel still more (1Th. 4:1-2)
 - 1. (vs. 1) "Finally then, brethren, we request and exhort you in the Lord Jesus"
 - "that as you received from us instruction as to how you ought to walk and please God"
 - "just as you actually do walk,"
 - But there is still room for improvement: "that you excel still more."

- 1. (vs. 2) The Thessalonians are not unaware of how to excel still more:
 - For you know what commandments we gave you by the authority of the Lord Jesus."
